

Aberdeen Global Opportunities Fund



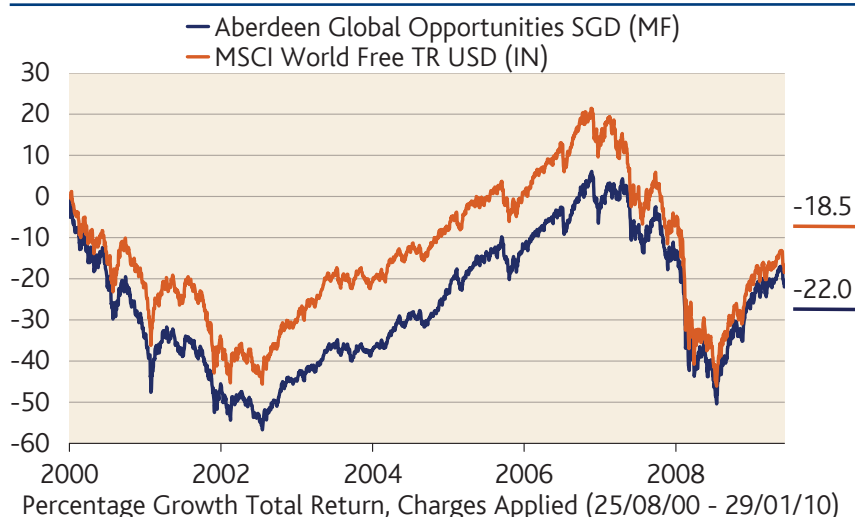
Fund objective

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Fund manager's report

- Global equities fell in January, on concerns over potential tightening measures by Asian central banks and US proposals to limit the size of financial institutions. European markets bucked the trend, helped by encouraging economic data.
- China raised the amount banks must set aside as reserves and ordered a temporary halt in lending. India hiked the cash reserve ratio and the Philippines raised its discount rate. In contrast, Europe kept monetary policy unchanged.
- China's economy expanded by 10.7% year-on-year in the fourth quarter. The US GDP also grew sharply, fuelled by slower inventory depletion. Industrial output in the Eurozone was buoyant in November.
- We introduced telecommunications company China Mobile on attractive valuations. In contrast, we pared City Developments, Standard Chartered and Philips Electronics.
- In view of the strong gains in 2009, we expect returns from equities to moderate in the year ahead. So far, economic recovery has been underwhelming, given the support from extraordinary stimulus measures, which the more cash-strapped nations are likely to withdraw later this year.
